Create a role-play or write a short story that demonstrates how to help your friend.

In your play/story think about:

- What you could do to help your friend.
- Who you might need to ask for help.
- How you might best communicate with your friend and others in this scenario.
- What medicine they might need? Who should be in charge of giving them this medicine?




#### Become a researcher

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Create an advertisement

Sometimes medicine isn't the best solution when someone is sick and they don't have a medical condition.

Create an advertisement poster that shows other things someone can do instead of taking medication to help them feel better.
